This cohort of students, as a consequence of the COVID-19 pandemic, were the first group of young people to miss out on sitting their crucial GCSE exams, and their final summer term of secondary school. However, they did not let these adverse experiences dampen their aspirations. HIGHER EDUCATION



Similar to the previous year, a number of talks were remote, with students gathering together in the Cube to listen to key speakers regarding how to apply to university, what to include in the personal statement and student finance. However, a few speakers did venture out from behind their screens and deliver in-person talks. In-addition to listening to presentations on key topics, students were also supported by teaching staff in Higher Education week workshops, where their researched university choices and courses, as well as beginning the all-important university application through the UCAS website.

APPRENTICESHIP WEEK



As with the previous year, a number of employer apprenticeship talks were delivered on-line. These important employer presentations did not take place in one week, as the title suggests, but instead they were hosted throughout the year as employers became available and were keen to recruit new apprentices. All students were supported with their apprenticeship applications in a weekly timetabled Destinations lesson, with some students receiving additional support from external career experts to ensure their applications were successful.

At Elutec Academy apprenticeship applications are taken as seriously as University applications. All students are fully supported to achieve the destination of their choice through engagement in employer-led projects, regular termly presentations from employers on how to complete a strong apprenticeship application, and support from key staff.

Our Sixth Form students are leaving Brook 6th Form and Academy with remarkable results in a historic year. They are moving forward with hope and undiminished expectation to the next stage in their lives having gained impressive and secure destinations in 2022.



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
